HE AND HIS WIFE, WHOSE MAIDEN NAME WAS MAUD LOUISE TIMMERMAN, HAD MADE THEIR HOME RECENTLY AT THE WEBSTER HOTEL, 2150 LINCOLN PARK WEST, CHICAGO. THEY WERE MARRIED JUNE 18, 1900. SHE OUTLIVED HIM BUT FOUR DAYS. HE WAS BORN FEBRUARY 14, 1865, ON THE SITE OF WHAT IS NOW THE CHICAGO PUBLIC LIBRARY, THE SON OF HOMER EARLE SARGENT (1822-1900) AND REBECCA EDDY WHEATON.

HOMER EARLE SARGENT WAS BORN IN LEICESTER, MASS., ATTENDED LEICESTER ACADEMY, AND THEN WENT

INTO RAILROADING. HE ADVANCED TO GENERAL MANAGER OF THE BOSTON & ALBANY RAILROAD, AND THEN MOVED TO CHICAGO TO ACCEPT MANAGERIAL POSITIONS SUCCESSIVELY WITH THE MICHIGAN CENTRAL AND THE NORTHERN PACIFIC RAILROADS. FOR HIS SERVICES TO THE STATE NORTH DAKOTA NAMED ONE OF ITS COUNTIES "SARGENT". ON THE SARGENT SIDE HE WAS A FOURTH COUSIN ONCE REMOVED AND ON THE DENNY SIDE A THIRD COUSIN OF THE BROTHERS JOSEPH BRADFORD SARGENT (1822-1907) AND GEORGE HENRY SARGENT (1828-1917). (THE RELATIONSHIP IS SHOWN IN A CHART IN SARGENTRIVIA OF APRIL 18, 1944.) THE THREE MEN WERE THE FINANCIAL BACKERS FOR THE 1895 EDITION OF THE SARGENT GENEALOGY.

AND 96 PIGS WEIGHING 16,860 LBS., WHICH WOULD MAKE SOME CHEWING. THE FARMERS IN THE MIDDLE WEST AS ELSEWHERE ARE WORKED HARD BECAUSE OF SHORTAGE OF HELP AND IN SOME CASES OF EQUIPMENT, BUT ARE DOING THEIR BEST TOWARD SUPPLYING FOOD FOR THE NATION AND ITS ARMED FORCES."

WE CERTAINLY HAD A VERY ANXIOUS TIME. A TREE FELL ON SARGENT'S HOUSE IN PORTLAND, DURING THE HURRICANE. THE CITY CAME, TOOK THE TREE, LEFT THE STUMP. ONE SATURDAY THEY CAME FOR THE STUMP, PULLED IT UP AND BROKE OR DISCONNECTED THE GAS PIPE - THE DEEP FREEZE CAME ON. ANNETTE (SARGENT'S WIFE) AND FREDERICK, OLDEST BOY, WERE IN THE KITCHEN. HE HAD JUST COME IN, SO WAS HEAVILY CLOTHED, WHICH SAVED HIM, ALTHO BADLY BURNED. THE CELLAR DOOR BLEW OPEN, AND MASS OF FLAMES WHIRLED AROUND. VERY SHORT DISTANCE TO DOOR. "SARGENT MARRIED ANNETTE SMITH IN 1940. THEY HAVE THREE BOYS - FREDERICK SMITH, 1941, JAMES SARGENT, 1943, WILLARD SARGENT, 1949. BRADFORD (HER THIRD SON) MARRIED JANE HARVEY IN 1942. THEY HAVE FOUR CHILDREN - BRADFORD, JR., 1943, JANE STAPLES, 1947, EVELYN SARGENT, 1951, AND AMY SMITH, 1953. OUR SECOND SON, LIONEL FREDERICK, JR., WAS KILLED HUNTING DURING A THANKSGIVING VACATION.

HE WAS A SENIOR AT BOWDOIN (WHICH ALL THREE SONS ATTENDED)."

SARGENT & COMPANY IN 1952 SIGNED AN AGREEMENT WITH ETABLISSEMENTS VACHETTE, FRENCH LOCK MAKERS SINCE 1873 WITH HEADQUARTERS IN PARIS AND FACTORIES AT TROYES AND AT SAILLY, WHICH PROVIDES THAT SARGENT & COMPANY WILL FURNISH PRODUCT DRAWINGS AND ENGINEERING ASSISTANCE FOR ARTICLES OF ITS MANUFACTURE TO VACHETTE, WHICH WILL PAY SARGENT & COMPANY A ROYALTY ON EACH ITEM MANUFACTURED AND SOLD. VACHETTE SENT ENGINEERS TO SARGENT IN 1952 FOR THE STUDY OF ITS 4500 LINE OF SELF-ALIGNING. BORED-IN LOCKS, AND RECEIVED IN 1953 COMPLETE PRODUCT ENGINEERING INFORMATION. VACHETTE BUILT AND EQUIPPED A NEW PLANT AT SAILLY AND IN OCTOBER 1954 BEGAN PRODUCTION OF THE 4505 FRONT DOOR CYLINDER LOCK, THE 4564 - 5 BATHROOM LOCK, AND THE 4515 LATCH. AT CHRISTMAS TIME, VACHETTE HELD A MEETING OF ALL ITS SALESMEN, AND THE ACTIVE PROMOTION AND SALE OF THE LINE BEGAN IN JANUARY 1955. VACHETTE IN ITS PREPARATIONS HAS SPENT 50,000,000 FRANCS (\$145,000). IT INTRODUCES INTO FRANCE, OTHER PARTS OF EUROPE, AND INTO AFRICA A LOCK NEW TO THOSE MARKETS. ETABLISSEMENTS VACHETTE WAS FOUNDED AT TROYES IN 1873 BY THE BROTHERS EMILE AND AMIDEE. JACQUES FRON, THE PRESENT WORKS MANAGER, IS A GRANDSON-IN-LAW OF EMILE, AND PAUL BABEAU, THE PRESENT SALES MANAGER, IS A GRANDSON-IN-LAW OF AMIDEE VACHETTE. IN OCTOBER 1954 HUBERT FROM AND JACQUES BABEAU, SONS OF THE PRESENT MANAGERS, REPRESENTING THE FOURTH GENERATION, CAME TO NEW HAVEN FOR A YEAR'S TRAINING IN FACTORY AND SALES METHODS. THEY WILL RETURN TO FRANCE IN SEPTEMBER 1955, AND WILL ENTER THEIR FAMILY BUSINESS WITH TIME OUT FOR THEIR MILITARY SERVICE.

THE U.S. FOREIGN OPERATIONS ADMINISTRATION INVITES GROUPS OF EUROPEANS TO THIS COUNTRY FOR STUDY OF OUR WAYS OF DOING THINGS. RECENTLY EIGHT FRENCH EDUCATORS ARRIVED FOR A SIX WEEKS' STUDY OF OUR VOCATIONAL TRAINING METHODS IN MARKETING AND DISTRIBUTING. ONE OF THESE WAS M. PAUL PACÉ OF TROYES, A FRIEND OF M. FRON AND M. BABEAU OF ETABLISSEMENTS VACHETTE. HE ASKED TO BE DETOURED FOR A STUDY OF SARGENT METHODS AND SPENT FEBRUARY 7 AND 8 AT SARGENT & COMPANY.
