MONTPELIER -- Raymond Evans Dimick, 86, died Friday, July 2, 1993, at his home in Montpelier.

He was born June 11, 1907, in Wardboro, Idaho, to Francis Alma and Celia Alice Evans Dimick. He was educated in Montpelier and later married Vivienne Ruth Tuel-ler on January 3, 1945, in Elko, Nev. The marriage was later sol-lemnized in the Logan LDS Temple on June 20, 1952.

He was an active member of the LDS Church and has served as a ward clerk for many years. His major employment had been with the Union Pacific Railroad, and he retired from there in 1973. He served with the U.S. Army from 1933 to 1936, and then when World War II came, he enlisted with the Army Air Corps and served from 1941 to 1945.

He is survived by his wife of Montpelier, two sons, David T. Dimick of Englewood, Colo.; and Neil F. Dimick of Laguna Hills, Calif.; 9 grandchildren and 1 sister, Mrs. Richard (Virginia) Collipriest of Montpelier. He was preceded in death by 6 brothers and sisters, Donald, Kenneth, Ralph, Evelyn Elaine and Lillian.

Funeral services will be held Tuesday, July 6, 1993, at 1 p.m. with Bishop Jerry Gundersen con-ducting in the Montpelier Stake Center, where friends may call that day for one hour prior to the ser-vice. Burial will be in the Montpe-lier Cemetery with services under the direction of Matthews Mortu-ary.
