
## Kenneth M. Regan

Kenneth Michael Regan died suddenly at his home on March 4, 2018 in Killingworth, Connecticut. He was 66 years old.

After a whirlwind romance, including Ken moving up to Connecticut from Philadelphia, the couple married in 1984. Ken could always be found cheering at his kids' sporting events and attending their plays and concerts.

Ken started his long and successful career as a commercial lighting salesman in Philadelphia in the late 70's. He came to be known in the business as Regal Regan, Lord of Light.
